Discussion Questions

10. What qualities define a leader who "finishes well" in God's service (Joshua 23:1–16)?

Courage and Dependence on God, Single-hearted Devotion, Integrity and Consistency, and a Vision Beyond themselves. Joshua witnessed and experienced that victories come from God and not human strength, as indicated through walking around the Jericho Wall. Leaders must always devote themselves to God and walk faithfully until the end.

11. How can today's leaders ensure they leave a Godly legacy for the next generation?

A leader should model the characteristics of Christ, share God's Word in and out of season, mentor and disciple the next generation, model holiness through living with integrity, celebrate God's faithfulness and share testimonies of God's proven record, and finish the race of serving God strongly.
