Answer: It shows that people often prefer familiar suffering over uncertain freedom, and that fear can lead to rebellion even after witnessing God's power.

18. In Numbers 11, the people craved meat and rejected manna. What does this show about contentment and trust in God?

Answer: It reveals how easily people can become dissatisfied, even when their needs are met, and how longing for past comforts can lead to spiritual discontent and judgment.
