ANSWERS

In the Midst of Trouble, Seek God's Presence
The Study of Psalm 27:5-8

1. According to verse 5, what will the Lord do for David in the day of trouble?

ANSWER: God will keep him safe in his dwelling, hide David in His shelter in the sacred tent, and set him high upon a rock.

2. How does David describe God's protection in verse 5?

ANSWER: David describes God's protection as sheltering him in His dwelling, hiding him in His tent, and setting him high upon a rock.

3. What does David say he will do in God's sanctuary? (verse 6)

ANSWER: David says he will offer sacrifices with shouts of joy, sing, and make music to the Lord.

David expresses his intention to offer sacrifices with joy and sing praises in God's sanctuary. He emphasizes the importance of worship and celebration in the presence of the Lord, highlighting a deep sense of trust and joy in God's protection and guidance!

4. What will David do as a response to God's protection (verse 6)? Can you think of a time when you felt God's protection?

ANSWER: My head will be exalted above the enemies who surround me.

David acknowledges that God delivered him from danger and desires to share his testimony with others. He strives to align his actions with God's will, demonstrating a life of faith. David expresses gratitude for God's protection through worship, prayer, and psalms. He writes songs of praise, reflects on God's faithfulness, and seeks to live in a way that honors God.

David uses imagery like being hidden in God's shelter and placed on a high rock to illustrate the safety and stability God provides. This imagery conveys a sense of unshakable security, where God lifts him above danger and ensures his safety.

5. What is David's attitude as he cries out to the Lord in verse 7?

David's prayers reflect his trust in God's responsiveness and his acknowledgment of his constant need for divine help.

9. What is the significance of David seeking God's face in verse 8?

Unlike seeking help or guidance, seeking God's face implies a longing for personal communion, understanding, and presence. This pursuit reflects David's trust in God amid difficulties, emphasizing the importance of spiritual connection over mere requests for assistance.

David's longing to see God's face also represents his quest for clarity and direction and a yearning for holiness and righteousness. Overall, it highlights the foundational theme of the psalm: reliance on God as a source of strength and refuge during challenging times.
